SCRANTON, Pa. (July 8, 2015) – Pennsylvania American Water customers in the Luzerne Street and Keyser Valley area of Scranton might experience temporary service disruptions on **Thursday, July 9** as crews make repairs to a broken valve near Luzerne Street and Meridian Avenue. Customers might experience no water, low pressure or cloudy water during construction, which is scheduled to begin on Thursday at 6 a.m. and could last up to 12 hours.

Customers along the following streets might experience low pressure or no water:

- Fawnwood Drive
- Whitetail Drive
- Deerfield Drive
- Red Oak Drive
- Forest Glen Drive
- Oakwood Drive
- White Birch Drive
- Luzerne Street

Customers on nearby streets off Luzerne Street might also experience low pressure or discolored water during while work is occurring.

To ease inconvenience, water tankers are available at following locations. Customers are asked to bring their own containers:

- Walgreens – Main Avenue and Luzerne Street
- Scranton Fire Dept. Engine #7 – Luzerne Street
- Price Rite Shopping Center – Luzerne Street

Once the work is completed, customers might experience cloudy water for a short period. Customers should run the faucets for a few minutes until the water runs clear.

During construction, Luzerne Street will be closed to traffic from 10th Avenue to Meridian Avenue. Drivers should find an alternate route.
