12	I will now call on each council
13	member for the few brief remarks.
14	Mr. Perry, do you have any comments at this
15	time?
16	MR. PERRY: Just very briefly, I just
17	want to thank everyone for coming out and
18	supporting us and supporting our city,
19	that's very important and it's just always
20	great to see such community involvement
21	which the City of Scranton always has.
22	I just want to send a special thank
23	you out to my wife Lori. She is unable to
24	attend today but I know she would really
25	like to and my whole family for just the

support. Anybody who is active in the community or in the public sector knows that your family is your backbone and you're only as strong as your family props you up to be and I know my family goes 110 percent for me.

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I also want to congratulate Councilman Donahue on the newest member to council. I'm looking forward to working with him and I know he is going to do a great job, and also congratulations to Mr. Gaughan and Mr. Rogan on their win as well. I'm excited to work again for the city for another two years to finish my term out and to get back to work with my new set of colleagues and let's get some stuff done. Thank you.

MR. ROGAN: Thank you. Mr. Donahue, do you have any comments at this time? MR. DONAHUE: Yes, just briefly. First off, I would like to just very thank my beautiful fiancee Mary Kate for continuing to always be standing by my side and for always supporting me 100 percent. I would not be sitting here today without an

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1	outstanding support system, so I must
2	absolutely thank my family, especially my

17	in politics are extremely rare so it's
18	something that I'm very humbled to have that
19	honor of. Over the next four years there are
20	a lot of challenges that the city faces, but
21	I want to take a minute to thank outgoing
22	Council President Joe Wechsler for his
23	leadership through the years, and Council
24	President Bob McGoff, who is no longer with
25	us, and if it wasn't for those two

individuals we wouldn't have the opportunity that we have today to do a lot of the proactive things we are going to do in these next couple of years to help benefit the City of Scranton. Over the next two years as I serve

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as council president my focus is going to be on continuing the legacy that city council has had over the last four years and now that we have finally got ourself in a financially position where we are not constantly trying to correct the mistakes of the past to lead some proactive endeavors to help the business community and help grow our city, create family sustaining jobs, help our neighborhoods. Basic services are what people come to city government for and that's our responsibility to deliver those services to the residents of Scranton.
