The City of Scranton's Non-Uniform Municipal Pension Board held their monthly meeting on Wednesday, January 16, 2019 at 9:30 A.M. in City Council Chambers.

**President Hazzouri** asked for a prayer and a moment of silence to honor the memory of Magistrate James Kennedy who passed away on January 11, 2019.

**President Hazzouri** asked for a motion to accept the minutes of last month's meeting held on Wednesday, December 19, 2018.

Mrs. Reed made a motion to accept the minutes from the December 19<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Mrs. Novembrino seconded the motion.

President Hazzouri: All in favor? (All were in favor) The ayes have it.

## President Hazzouri read the following agenda items:

- 1. An invoice from Durkin MacDonald, LLC in the amount of \$2,276.50 for services rendered from December 18, 2018 through January 14, 2019 was presented for payment. Mrs. Novembrino made the motion to pay and Mrs. Reed seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- 2. An application for a pension of \$700.00 per month for Kathleen McGinn was presented for approval. Ms. McGinn is retiring on January 31, 2019. President Hazzouri offered words of praise for Ms. McGinn. He said she was a hard worker and did an excellent job as payroll clerk. Mrs. Novembrino made the motion to approve Ms. McGinn's pension application and Mrs. Reed seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- 3. An application for a pension of \$550.00 per month for Marilyn Miller was presented for approval. Mrs. Miller is retiring on January 31, 2019. Mrs. Kennedy said that Mrs. Miller is retiring on January 28<sup>th</sup> and that the record should reflect the correct date. Mrs. Reed made a motion to amend the date of retirement for Mrs. Miller as January 28, 2019 and to approve her pension application. Mrs. Novembrino seconded the amended motion. All were in favor.
- 4. An application for a pension of \$700.00 per month for John Finnerty was presented for approval. Mr. Finnerty is retiring on February 28, 2019. Mrs. Reed made the motion to approve Mr. Finnerty's pension application and Mrs. Kennedy seconded the motion. All were in favor.

**President Hazzouri** opened the meeting to the Board.

Attorney Durkin reported that the appeal by Joseph Schimes was in the preliminary stages with Commonwealth Court and there has not been a briefing scheduled yet.

Attorney Durkin brought up the issue with Mike Lynady. Mr. Lynady submitted his paperwork, which was approved by the Board. He then accepted a position in the clerical union with the City before his paperwork was submitted to Thomas Anderson and Associates so he did not receive any pension benefits. He asked to have his paperwork put on hold when he returned to work. He was advised at that time, that it would be to his benefit to continue contributing to the fund. The question is whether or not Mr. Lynady should be contributing to the fund and, according to Attorney Durkin, he should be contributing. Because if you retire, then you come back in to City service, pension benefits would be suspended. If you come back in to City service after you've retired, and you are in a pension qualifying position, then you do need to make the contributions. You could have a situation where you accrue enough time where your pension changes. Attorney Durkin said he would provide a written opinion on the matter.

**President Hazzouri** opened the meeting to the floor.

Laura Hendricks from the Albright Memorial Library inquired about a library employee who retired last year and returned to work there. This person was told that he had to freeze his pension. Attorney Durkin stated that there is a state law which prohibits a person from collecting a paycheck and a pension from the same employer. It is called double dipping. Ms. Hendricks stated that the employee knew he could not collect his pension; however, he wanted to keep contributing to the level. the next Attorney pension fund order to get to Durkin was of the opinion that this employee could contribute to the pension fund even though his pension was frozen. Ms. Hendricks stated that this employee intends to stay employed with the library for at least the next ten years.

Attorney Durkin's opinion was that if you are in a position for which part of the compensation is accrual of a pension benefit, then you should continue to contribute to the pension fund. The question is whether or not this would change the benefit you receive when you do retire. Attorney Durkin was of the opinion that it could affect the benefit you receive when you retire. Attorney Durkin said that he checked with Jim Kennedy from Thomas Anderson to see what other municipalities do in this

situation. He said it is not uncommon for employees to return to work with their previous employers and have their pensions frozen.

**President Hazzouri** asked if the Board would agree with him to bring in Eileen Hurchick for a work session on this matter.

Mrs. Reed made a motion that we table this issue until we could get a work session with Eileen to discuss this matter. Mrs. Novembrino seconded the motion.

All were in favor and the motion was approved.

**President Hazzouri** asked for a motion to adjourn. Mrs. Reed made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Mrs. Kennedy seconded the motion. All were in favor.

**David Mitchell...** Called the meeting to order.

### Correspondence:

The report from PFM that Mark will go over.

Three Biennial Reports that were sent from Jim Kennedy. He asked Jim if he was going to go over that later on from Beyer Barber. Jim said there is nothing to go over. These are data requests that we do with them for the 1/1/19 Valuation. It's prep materials on what they need and they automatically send those out annually. His office handles all of that.

We received a copy of the amended Trust that we voted on last year, signed off by the City and the Board.

A copy of the notice that our secretary sent out for the Sunshine Law to the Scranton Times to advertise our meeting for the 2019 calendar year.

### Bills:

In the amount of \$255.70 to the Scranton Times. Motion to pay made by Roseann Novembrino, seconded by John Hazzouri, all were in favor.

The next bill is for \$10,223.34 for PFM Asset Management for 11/1 to 11/30. Motion to pay made by John Hazzouri, seconded by Danielle Kennedy, all were in favor.

The next bill is in the amount of \$362.50 for legal services to Durkin & MacDonald. Motion made by John Hazzouri to pay this bill, seconded by Lori Reed, all were in favor.

Dave asked for a Motion to accept the Minutes of December 19, 2018. Motion made by John Hazzouri to accept the Minutes, seconded by Roseann Novembrino, all were in favor.

Dave asked the Board members if they had anything.

**John Hazzouri...** Congratulated Kathy McGinn on her retirement and thanked her for staying on as the recording secretary for the Board.

**Jim Kennedy...** Only as a formality that he talked with Dave Bulzoni and Lori about having Council put in their Minutes the revised MMO for 18 and 19 based on the bond transaction just because of the update to the previous one. It's just housekeeping.

Dave Mitchell... He wanted to add to what John Hazzouri said about Kathy, he was notified over the past month that our secretary is retiring from her employment with the City of Scranton but she has asked to stay on as the Board secretary, that's legal and it's in our bi-laws and it's been done in the past. He personally doesn't have a problem with it and she did indicate to him in her e-mail that she sent that when it does come time that she would like to leave the Board that she would give them ample notice so we could get someone in to train them and go forth.

Mark Yasenchak... Distributed his report to the Board and made his presentation. December ended up being somewhat of a disaster across markets. There really wasn't any positive market returns for the stock perspective, fixed income had a great return perspective what yields did what they probably should have. The markets committee met in December and did decide to raise rates, as I spoke in November I'm personally a little skeptical that they would do that, interesting after they raised rates. The talk became pretty concrete that they would slow down in 2019 in terms of raising rates. They want to stay on track. They had given to the market in terms of commentary and did end up having that forth rate hike in 2018 that sent bond yields in the other direction.

If you look at the Total Return of Major Indices Chart, the Bloomberg Barclays was up 1.84% in the month of December. Look across to the year to date column that got it to a .01% a positive flat for all intents and purposes return. Continually year after year we've talked about rates, talked about rates going up as the rest of the assessment community has as well.

Yesterdays close was about 273 for a 10 year treasury. It was 269 at the end of December. Short term rates continue to move up. Long term rates do nothing or move down you can see that in the U.S Treasury Yield Chart. The yellow dotted line is the 11/30 yield curve. The blue solid line is the 12/31 yield curve, so rates came down pretty much across the board. Anytime rates come down it's a positive for fixed income investments. Not what we're expecting. You'll see when we get to the portfolio all fixed income managers across the board. Nobody expected rates to continue to go backwards. The S&P was down 9% in December roughly through Christmas time, we started an upswing back up and pretty well since. It was a disastrous month for equities.

Obviously we're not going to see good things in the portfolio for December. We continue to believe the fundamentals of the markets are good and these backups to the volatility only creates potential opportunity going into 2019 for better returns. There are a few things to think about, the federal government shut down, nobody expected it to escalate to where it has and there is not end in sight there. It is going to be harder to make sense out of economic data if this continues. The economic environment appears to continue to be good. Wages went up about 3%. There are a lot of signs that the economy is doing well but then when you look out and say you have a government shut down here in the U.S. The emerging markets have their own challenges. There are not a lot of signs of lower volatility. The S&P 500 for yesterday was up 3.7% in January. We're probably at the 4+% range on that upswing.

He then reviewed the portfolio. The one month return for December was -3.75, that got us to a 2018 return of -4.25. That is mildly ahead of the benchmark which was -4.33. December was a difficult month to make up any ground. Not much worked in our favor in December, these things that have worked in the last year and a half.

We are thus far in 19 shaping up pretty well. The equity allocation is up about 2.5% as of yesterday. We had our investment meeting and there were no changes to the portfolio. John Hazzouri said we were at \$97 million as of last Friday, so that means we're up \$5 million or \$4.5 million since last Friday. He asked Mark what his opinion is about 60/40. Mark's opinion is if we were starting from scratch we are on the side of conservatism. He said the plan is trying to meet actuarial assumptions and not lowering to the extremes that they would need to be more confident in meeting those then the higher equity allocations is somewhat needed. As he has said before our allocation is about 55% equities is conservative compared to most municipalities. A majority of those who are using competitive advisors tend to be more along the lines of 60% equity. We can make lower actuary assumptions a quarter of a percent or something like that but really there are two levels to poll. Either we make the goal smaller or we take on more risk. We have some plans that are 75% equity. John Hazzouri said he wouldn't go that high. Mark said from a clean plate perspective 60/40 he would suggest to you or whatever numbers you decided

to suggest. If you said 55 is that conservative, I would say 64 is conservative too. He thinks they're both in the realm or the right ballpark. He thinks timing of it he might be a little concerned about. Obviously if he said 60/40 and now is the time to do it would conflict with the fact that we need to invest the entire \$28 million all at once.

So if you thought there was opportunity now in this point in time, not saying there isn't but the confidence level isn't high enough to where we would want to invest the money you put in the plan today let alone when you increase the risk going into 60% equity. Two different perspectives going there, he leans towards the latter at this point. Again it's the longer term 60/40 is kind of conservative. He would be comfortable with it. He thinks there is some caution to be had. There is the inability to see what the real economic picture looks like. His suggestion would be that if it's a longer term it's something to keep an eye towards he wouldn't be ready to jump on it today.

We ended December 31<sup>st</sup> at \$92,409,436 with those net flows coming in during December and the loss on investment of (-\$2,875,990) As of last Friday the market value on the portfolio was \$97,670,036 roughly a \$5 million gain that does not include the disbursements that will occur on the 15<sup>th</sup>.







The attached is a final proposal by Neighborworks to create the Beautiful Blocks program. As you are aware this a matching grant program based on the Renaissance Program created by the City of Oswego, New York. The program is described in greater detail in the proposal. The program will be managed by Neighborworks similarly to the SHAP (Scranton Homeowner Assistance Program). Grants will be allocated by Neighborworks based on requests for block improvements.

The program liaison internally will be Chris Casciano, employed as an Equal Opportunity Specialist in the office of Economic and Community Development. Mr. Casciano will be responsible for the solicitation of contributions for the program. The program will be funded initially by a \$25,000 contribution from the University of Scranton and from funds remaining in the Rental Registration Escrow account. This initial funding amount will be allocated to Neighborworks as the program funding base.

Please prepare the necessary legislation for legislative approval.

## **Beautiful Blocks Program Proposal**

### **Program Overview**

Through a partnership between the City of Scranton and NeighborWorks

Northeastern Pennsylvania, the Beautiful Blocks Program will encourage groups of neighbors to improve their homes by providing matching grants for exterior improvements. The median listing price of homes in Scranton is just over \$100,000, while the national median listing price is approximately \$275,000. The Beautiful Blocks Program seeks to not only narrow this disparity but also build community through concentrated home improvement projects that beautify a neighborhood.

The Beautiful Blocks Program is modeled after the City of Oswego's successful Renaissance Block Challenge Grant program. The goal of the program is to provide an incentive for groups of five or more neighbors to work together to make exterior improvements to their homes, which will make neighborhoods more attractive places to live and increase property values over time. Through the program, each property owner can receive a matching grant of up to \$1,000 for exterior home improvements. These grants will afford Scranton residents the opportunity to define their neighborhoods and take the revitalization of the city into their own hands.

#### **Program Highlights**

- Property owners are eligible for a matching grant of up to \$1,000 for exterior home improvements, from large (siding, windows, roofs, sidewalks, etc.) to small (window boxes, flower pots, welcome mats, etc.)
- Grants are awarded through a competitive application process, and awards are based upon the
  availability of funding and the number and quality of applications received.
- Target zones focus revitalization efforts on key neighborhoods.
- Additional grant funds (on top of the \$1000 matching grants) may be provided for related community projects (park cleanups, block parties, etc.).

#### Eligibility

The Beautiful Blocks Program will be open to groups of five or more neighbors, provided the following requirements are met:

- All homes must be located in the City of Scranton.
- Grants must be used for exterior home improvements.
- Neighboring homes must be located on the same street or block.
- If a block has previously received a Beautiful Blocks grant, they may reapply after a 2-year period. However, at least 50% of the homes must not have participated in the past.

#### Other Incentives

- NeighborWorks staff can assist grantees with planning and coordinating projects.
- Grantees may borrow tools and equipment to help them complete their projects.

PENNSYLVANIA

#### **Target Zones**

To increase the impact of the Beautiful Blocks Program, target zones will identified and prioritized during the selection process. This does not exclude applications from outside of these zones, but preference will be given to applications for homes inside designated target zones.

The City of Scranton, together with NeighborWorks staff, can select the target zones. For greatest impact, we recommend selecting stable but at-risk neighborhoods. In this way, the Beautiful Blocks Program can help prevent these neighborhoods from declining and, instead, increase demand for homes in these neighborhoods.

#### **Budget (First Year)**

Total	\$68,000
Trailer, tools, and equipment	\$8,000
Program administration	\$10,000
Grant funds	\$50,000

#### **Program Administration**

NeighborWorks would administer the program on behalf of the city, providing assistance with:

- Program management
- Marketing
- Selection committee facilitation
- Fundraising
- Storage and care of tools and equipment
- Community project planning and coordination

#### **Process**

Beautiful Blocks grants would be awarded in the following way:

- 1. An annual or semi-annual funding round is announced, and the application deadline is set.
- 2. NeighborWorks staff meet with neighbors interested in applying to explain program and informally vet projects.
- 3. Applicants complete and submit a grant application that includes:
  - o Names and addresses of all participating property owners.
  - O Designated block captain to serve as the primary contact person.
  - o Photos of the project area.
  - A detailed plan for using the grant funds.
  - o Project budget with contractor estimates (if applicable)
- 4. Applications that meet all eligibility requirements are forwarded to the selection committee.
- 5. The selection committee reviews and selects the best projects.
- 6. Grants are awarded and work commences.

**7.** Following completion of the projects, grantees submit a final report with photos of the completed project.

#### Selection Criteria

Projects will be selected by a selection committee based on a scoring rubric. The selection committee will be made up of NeighborWorks staff, city officials, and representatives of neighborhood associations. Preference will be given to applications that:

- Include a high number of tightly clustered properties.
- Are located in a designated target zone.
- Demonstrate how neighbors will work together to complete improvements.
- Include future plans for continuing to improve the properties and neighborhood.

#### AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING INSTALLATION OF NO PARKING SIGNS ALONG THE NORTHERLY AND SOUTHERLY SIDES OF BROADWAY STREET ALONG THE BICYCLE LANES IN THE VICINITY OF THE TRAIL CROSSINGS NEAR THE UNIVERSITY OF SCRANTON SPORTS COMPLEX THAT WERE INSTALLED IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE LHVA SCRANTON SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT.

WHEREAS, as requested at a meeting on Tuesday January 8, 2019, LaBella Associates, the City Engineers, performed an evaluation for the purpose of deciding upon the installation of No Parking Signs on the northerly and southerly sides of Broadway Street along the bicycle lanes; and

WHEREAS, LaBella Associates performed site reconnaissance visits on Friday, January 11, 2019. It was brought to their attention in an e-mail dated October 22, 2018 from Corporal David Mitchell, SPD that he had received several complaints on vehicles parked in the bicycle lanes on Broadway Street in the vicinity of the trail crossings near the University of Scranton Sports complex. The bicycle lanes were installed in conjunction with the LVHA Scranton Safety Improvements Project. Corporal Mitchell indicated in order to make "no parking" enforceable in the bicycle lanes, the appropriate signs to prohibit parking must be in place.

WHEREAS, based on the information available to LaBella, Associates, and also upon their professional engineering experience and knowledge, it is their opinion with a reasonable degree of their Engineering Judgment that the following recommendations be implemented:

Parking along the northerly side of Broadway Street from the westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane which is 29 feet west of the edge of the stamped bituminous asphalt pave bicycle crossing path (green-herringbone) to a point 25 feet east of said westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane shall be restricted and/or prohibited. The length of the restricted/prohibited zone shall be 275 feet; Install R7-302 NO PARKING SYMBOL/ARROW SIGN (RIGHT) (12"x18") at the westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane on the northerly side of Broadway Street; Install R7-302 NO PARKING SYMBOL/ARROW SIGN (LEFT) (12"x18") at 275 feet east of the westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane on the northerly side of Broadway Street. This point being the easterly limit of the painted bicycle lane on the northerly side of Broadway Street; install Four (4) R7-302 NO PARKING SYMBOL/ARROW SIGNS (12"x18") along the


No Parking Signs

As requested at our meeting on Tuesday January 8, 2019, we have performed an evaluation of available pertinent information and have applied the appropriate principles, provisions, and practices as contained in the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways" (2009 Edition as revised) for the purpose of deciding upon the installation of No Parking Signs on the northerly and southerly sides of Broadway Street along the bicycle lanes.

Our office performed site reconnaissance visits on Friday January 11, 2019. It was brought to our attention in an e-mail dated October 22, 2018 from Corporal David Mitchell, SPD, that he had received several complaints on vehicles parked in the bicycle lanes on Broadway Street in the vicinity of the trail crossings near the University of Scranton Sports Complex. The bicycle lanes were installed in conjunction with the LVHA Scranton Safety Improvements Project. In a subsequent e-mail on October 23, 2018, Corporal Mitchell indicated that in order to make "no parking" enforceable in the bicycle lanes, the appropriate official signs to prohibit parking must be in place.

Therefore, based on the information currently available to us, and also upon our professional engineering experience and knowledge, it is our opinion with a reasonable degree of Engineering Judgment that the following recommendations be implemented:

- 1) Parking along the northerly side of Broadway Street from the westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane which is 29 feet west of the edge of the stamped bituminous asphalt pave bicycle crossing path (green-herringbone) to a point 275 feet east of said westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane shall be restricted and/or prohibited. The length of the restricted/prohibited zone shall be 275 feet.
- 2) Install R7-302 NO PARKING SYMBOL/ARROW SIGN (RIGHT) (12"x18") at the westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane on the northerly side of Broadway Street.




- 3) Install R7-302 NO PARKING SYMBOL/ARROW SIGN (LEFT) (12"x18") at 275 feet east of the westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane on the northerly side of Broadway Street. This point being the easterly limit of the painted bicycle lane on the northerly side of Broadway Street.
- 4) Install Four (4) R7-302 NO PARKING SYMBOL/ARROW SIGNS (12"x18") along the northerly side of Broadway Street as directed in the field by the City Engineer between the signs installed in items 2 and 3 above.
- 5) Parking along the southerly side of Broadway Street from the westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane which is 30 feet west of the edge of the stamped bituminous asphalt pave bicycle crossing path (green-herringbone) to a point 280 feet east of said westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane shall be restricted and/or prohibited. The length of the restricted/prohibited zone shall be 280 feet.
- 6) Install R7-302 NO PARKING SYMBOL/ARROW SIGN (LEFT) (12"x18") at the westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane on the southerly side of Broadway Street.
- 7) Install R7-302 NO PARKING SYMBOL/ARROW SIGN (RIGHT) (12"x18") at 280 feet east of the westerly limit of the painted bicycle lane on the southerly side of Broadway Street. This point being the easterly limit of the painted bicycle lane on the southerly side of Broadway Street.
- 8) Install Four (4) R7-302 NO PARKING SYMBOL/ARROW SIGNS (12"x18") along the southerly side of Broadway Street as directed in the field by the City Engineer between the signs installed in items 6 and 7 above.
- 9) It is the intent of this recommendation to prohibit parking as outlined in item 1 creating a 275 foot "No Parking" Zone and item 5 creating a 280 foot "No Parking" Zone.
- 10) Approval of Ordinance by City Council may be required.



WHEREAS, the City of Scranton and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Transportation, have coordinated through appropriate officials a multi-bridge project in the City of Scranton; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 89 of 2018 adopted November 27, 2018, Scranton City

Council authorized the Mayor and other appropriate City officials to execute for and on behalf of
the City of Scranton an agreement for the Commonwealth's performance of the multi-bridge
project; and

WHEREAS, the Bridges included in the Multi-Bridge Project are the West Lackawanna
Avenue Bridge over the railroad, Elm Street Bridge over Lackawanna River, North Main
Avenue Bridge over Leggetts Creek, and Parker Street over Lackawanna River; and

WHEREAS, the Department wishes to proceed in a prompt manner with the acquisition of all necessary right-of-ways for the multi-bridge project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2305 and 2307 of the General Local Government Code, 53 Pa. C.S. §§2305, 2307, and Para. 5 of Agreement No. 04M173, the City of Scranton hereby agreed and enacts this date the following Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ENACTED AND ORDAINED as follows: SECTION ONE. Delegation of Authority.

The City of Scranton hereby delegates to the Secretary of Transportation its authority to acquire the right-of-ways necessary for the multi-bridge project described and enumerated in Agreement 04M173, passed by City Council on November 27, 2018, said Agreement containing all applicable multi-bridge project terms and conditions incorporated by reference therein as if fully set forth:

#### SECTION TWO. Duration

This delegation shall continue until all multi-bridge project terms and conditions of Agreement No. 04M173 shall be fully satisfied or, at the election of the parties as set forth herein, the same shall be otherwise terminated:

#### SECTION THREE. Purpose and Scope of Delegation.

The Secretary of Transportation shall have the authority to acquire the right-of-ways necessary for the multi-bridge project described and enumerated in Document No. 04M173, passed by City Council on November 27,2018, subject to review and approval of the City of Scranton Business Administrator and City of Scranton Engineer as to the extent of the right-of-ways necessary for any project:

#### **SECTION FOUR. Financing**

One hundred percent of the right-of-way costs, along with all other costs under Agreement No. 04M173, is being funded with the combination of federal funds available through the Surface Transportation Plan, Z240; State funds available through the State Bridge Funds – Local,183; and through the City of Scranton 2018 Capital Budget:

#### SECTION FIVE. Organizational Structure.

#### E - Applicant (Municipal) Certification

The applicant desires to own, operate, and maintain the traffic control device in the location indicated above; and the Vehicle Code requires the approval of the Department of Transportation ("Department") before any traffic signals may be legally erected or modified. A signed Application for Traffic Signal Approval (TE-160) must be submitted in conformance with the instructions provided by the Department, and a Traffic Signal Permit must be issued, before any work can begin.

If the Department approves a traffic signal after a traffic engineering study and engineering judgment indicates the need, the traffic signal shall be installed, owned, operated, and maintained within the parameters indicated in the Vehicle Code and the Department's regulations relating to traffic signs, signals, and markings. The Department may direct appropriate alterations to the design or operation (including, but not limited to, hours of operation) of the traffic signal, or require removal of the traffic signal, if traffic conditions or other considerations necessitate alteration or removal.

All items associated with the traffic control device (geometric features, signs, signals, pavement markings, pedestrian accommodations, and other traffic control device associated items) are the applicant's responsibility. The Traffic Signal Permit will then document all of the items associated with operation of each traffic control device. The applicant, at its sole expense, shall provide the necessary inspection, maintenance, and operation activities in conformance with the Department's Publication 191 or as otherwise agreed to by the Department. The applicant shall perform the preventative and responsive maintenance requirements and recordkeeping in accordance with the exhibits specified below. If the applicant fails to provide the required inspection, maintenance, or operation services within thirty (30) days of receipt of written notice from the Department, the Department shall have the right to perform the required inspection, maintenance, or operation services in the applicant's stead and the applicant shall reimburse the Department for all costs incurred. Federal- and/or state-aid participation may be withheld on all future projects if the applicant fails to demonstrate to the Department the ability to provide all required maintenance and operation services. The applicant certifies that it has funds available and committed for the operation and maintenance of the traffic control device and that it will make available sufficient funds for all required future inspection, maintenance, and operation activities

The applicant shall indemnify, save harmless and, defend (if requested) the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, its agents, representatives, and employees from and against any damages recoverable under the Sovereign Immunity Act, 42 Pa. C.S. §§ 8521-8528, up to the limitations on damages under said law, arising out of any personal injury or damage to property which is finally determined by a court to be caused by or result from acts or omissions of the applicant and for which a court has held applicant, its officials, or employees to be liable. This provision shall not be construed to limit the applicant in asserting any rights or defenses. Additionally, the applicant shall include in any contracts into which it enters for maintenance, operation, or inspection of the traffic control device this same obligation to indemnify the Commonwealth and its officers, agents, and employees; and it shall require its contractor(s) to provide public liability insurance coverage, naming the Commonwealth and the applicant as additional insureds for bodily injury, including death and property damage, in the minimum amounts of \$500,000 per person, \$1,000,000 per occurrence, it being the intention of parties to have the contractor fully insure and indemnify the Commonwealth and the applicant.

The applicant shall comply with the study and ordinance requirements of 75 Pa. C.S. § 6109. The applicant submits this application with the intention of being legally bound.

Neither this application nor any Traffic Signal Permit creates any rights or obligations with respect to parties other than the applicant and the Department. Third parties may not rely upon any representations made by either the applicant or the Department in connection with the submission or approval of this application or any work permitted or approved that is related to this application, as regards either payment of funds or performance of any particular item of maintenance precisely as specified.

#### **Preventive Maintenance**

#### Recordkeeping

Accurate and up-to-date recordkeeping is an essential component of a good traffic signal maintenance program. In recognition of this fact, the APPLICANT must prepare, retain, and make available to the COMMONWEALTH, on request, a record of all preventive and response maintenance activities performed on the traffic signal equipment covered by this application.

The APPLICANT shall establish a separate file for each installation and keep its records in the municipal building, signal maintenance shop, or other weather-protected enclosure.

At a minimum, the following records will be kept by the APPLICANT or its contractor for each traffic signal. These forms can be found in Section 10.0, Maintenance Record Forms, PA DOT Publication 191, current version.

#### FORM 1 - Master Intersection Record

This form, which lists all maintenance functions performed at the intersection, should be updated within one day of the activity but no more than one week later.

#### FORM 2 - Response Maintenance Record

Each time response maintenance is required at the intersection, this form is to be completed. Once the pertinent information is transferred to the master intersection record, this form is to be placed in the intersection file.

#### FORM 3 - Preventive Maintenance Record

This form will be used to provide a record of the preventive maintenance activities performed at each intersection. The date, the activities performed, and the signature of the person in charge of the work must be recorded in the form.

This form may be kept at the intersection, if it is adequately protected from the weather. Form 1 must be updated at the central file, however, to reflect the date and activity.

#### Personnel Classifications

In order to properly maintain the traffic signal equipment covered by this applicant, the APPLICANT agrees to provide, as minimum, the following staff throughout the useful life of equipment. The APPLICANT agrees to abide by all guidance provided in PA DOT Publication 191.

<u>Traffic Engineer</u> - The administrative position which has prime responsibility for the proper operation of traffic signal equipment. The principal function of this position is the supervision and control of subordinate personnel and the planning of their activities to ensure adequate preventive and response maintenance programs.

#### Minimum Position Requirements

- 1. A thorough understanding of traffic signal design, installation and maintenance.

- 5. Either four years experience in the field of traffic engineering or its equivalent in graduate college work.

<u>Signal Specialist</u> - The individual responsible for the diagnostics and repair of all traffic signal equipment including solid state equipment.

#### Minimum Position Requirements

- 1. Extensive training and troubleshooting skills in electronics and software.
- 2. Ability to repair modules in the shop and to design test equipment needed to diagnose and repair a problem.
- 3. Ability to make design and modifications to implement or omit special functions.
- 4. Ability to implement a recordkeeping system to include maintenance activities, inventory control and identification of recurring problems.
- 5. Ability to perform all tasks required of a signal technician.

Signal Technician - Individual responsible for the operation and maintenance of traffic signals and electromechanical equipment.

#### Minimum Position Requirements

- 1. Ability to perform response maintenance on solid state equipment up to the device exchange level.
- 2. Capability to diagnose a vehicle loop failure and initiate corrective action.
- 3. Ability to tune detector amplifiers.
- 4. Ability to follow wiring schematics, check and set timings from plan sheet and check all field connections.
- 5. Ability to perform preventive maintenance on all equipment and to maintain accurate records of all work perform.

#### **Training**
