- Access to clinic staff and primary wound assessments from Scranton Primary Health Care Center
- Wi-Fi and laptops to report damages via PEMA's Public Damage Assessment Link
- Food vouchers and meals from local restaurants, including McDonald's, Goodfellas Pizza, Cooper's Seafood, and more
- Emergency housing information from United Neighborhood Centers of NEPA
- Temporary housing information and resources from the Scranton Housing Authority
