

At its regular meeting on Tues., Oct. 29, 2024, Scranton City Council:

1. Introduced an [ordinance](#) to approve an intergovernmental agreement between the City of Scranton and the Borough of Moosic regarding the coordination of zoning, planning, and code enforcement of 53 Glenmaura National Blvd., Scranton, which was purchased in December 2022 by Commonwealth Charter Academy. The ordinance was introduced by a vote of 4-1, with Councilmembers Gerald Smurl, Mark McAndrew, Thomas Schuster, and Dr. Jessica Rothchild in favor, and with Councilmember William F. King against.
2. Advanced an [ordinance](#) to donate a 2015 Ford Taurus Interceptor former patrol vehicle to the Career Technology Center of Lackawanna County (CTCLC). The vehicle is not longer of use to the Scranton Police Department. It will be restored by CTCLC students through their automotive departments and later used in its Protective Services Program that trains future first responders. The ordinance was advanced by a vote of 5-0.
3. Adopted a [resolution](#) to obligate \$40,830.57 in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds for the purchase and installation of street cameras in Qualified Census Tract (QCT) areas, specifically in the area of Connell Park. The resolution was adopted by a vote of 5-0.
4. Adopted a [resolution](#) to obligate \$99,732.50 in ARPA funds for engineering, design, and construction services for the Weston Field skate park. The resolution was adopted by a vote of 5-0.
5. Adopted a [resolution](#) to obligate \$1,082,536.54 in ARPA funds for splash pad equipment and other enhancements to the Capouse Avenue Park. The resolution was adopted by a vote of 5-0.
